PREPARING FOR A Smoke-free Illinois

On January 1, 2008, Illinois will become the 22nd smoke-free state in the nation. Beginning in the New Year, there will be no more smoking in any indoor workplace or public place. As a result of the Smoke-Free Illinois Act, Community Trust Credit Union will be implementing a new smoke-free policy on January 1, 2008. After this date, there will be no smoking anywhere on CTCU property.
